**Request of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)
to Conduct Youth Development Sessions for 4Ps Child Beneficiaries**

In response to the request of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), this office hereby **grants permission** to conduct **Youth Development Sessions (YDS)** for Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) child beneficiaries.

The conduct of these sessions is recognized as an important intervention to support the holistic development of learners, particularly in promoting social awareness, personal growth, and responsible citizenship among the youth.

To ensure that the implementation of this activity aligns with the school's academic priorities, the following conditions shall be observed:

1. **No Disruption of Core Learning Areas**

The scheduling of the Youth Development Sessions must not interfere with regular class hours, particularly in core learning areas such as English, Mathematics, Science, and other essential subjects.

2. **Coordination with School Administration**

The DSWD facilitators are required to closely coordinate with the school head or designated focal person to finalize schedules and venue arrangements.

Sessions may be conducted during non-instructional time, after class hours, or during agreed-upon periods that will not compromise academic instruction.

4. **Monitoring and Compliance**

Teachers and school personnel shall assist in monitoring the activity to ensure compliance with school policies and the welfare of participating learners.

This advisory serves as guidance to ensure that both educational objectives and developmental programs are effectively delivered without prejudice to the learners' academic progress.

In reference to the Department of Education's implementation of the revised Basic Education Calendar and the transition to a trimester-based academic schedule, we respectfully seek your permission and support to conduct **Youth Development Sessions (YDS)** for Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) child beneficiaries enrolled in secondary schools within the Dapitan City School Division.

The proposed conduct of the Youth Development Sessions is intended to continue the implementation of YDS activities initiated during the previous school year, which concluded in March 2026. - Baylimango National High School

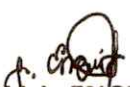
