



The Asia Foundation is a nonprofit international development organization committed to improving lives across a dynamic and developing Asia-Pacific. It is implementing a youth and education-focused program called the Youth Leadership for Democracy (YouthLed) in partnership with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). YouthLed aims to increase civic engagement leading to strengthened participation in Democratic Governance of the Filipino youth through leadership development, coalition-building, and civic education and engagement activities.

Under its Civic Education component, YouthLed will be implementing Project Citizen (PC), a civic education program that seeks to impart the critical skills students need to seek public policy interventions to solve community problems. Background of The Program

The Youth Leadership for Democracy (YouthLed) is a five-year program being implemented by The Asia Foundation and funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). YouthLed aims to increase and improve civic engagement through its three main components: leadership development, coalition-building, and civic education & engagement activities in contexts that are relevant to the youth, while supporting their meaningful participation in democratic governance.

Putting focus on the third component of YouthLed—Civic Education is the foundation for active citizen participation, understanding of civil rights, duties and responsibilities and enhanced political participation. It is generally understood as the formation of civic knowledge, skills, and disposition for effective democratic participation¹. A well-informed civic education program especially for the youth provides a strong foundation for leadership, citizenship, community participation leading towards nation building.

YouthLed's strategy of providing opportunities for the youth to engage and learn via online and offline platforms, can prove strategic for civic education. Providing digital engagement learning opportunities in the form of developing students' capacities to create and share media and perspectives is another way to actively engage the youth in issues they feel passionately about. It would also be worthwhile to help youth consume digital media thoughtfully by becoming better judges of the accuracy or credibility of online content.

It is through this lens of civic participation via social interventions, leadership and community programs that promote civic participation and understanding outside of the academic setting; and online and offline interventions and activities that encourage youth political participation that YouthLed will work in the development of "Project Citizen."

About Project Citizen

As Project Citizen will be implemented as a civic education program, it will or may be integrated in the school curriculum or can be implemented as a co-curricular project. Both activities aim to impart the critical skills students need to seek public policy interventions to solve community problems. As a Service-Learning pedagogy, it will provide learning activities at the community to immerse and expose students to the dynamics of democratic participation, public policy formulation, implementation, evaluation and monitoring. Specifically, Project Citizen aims to:

- 1. Introduce the concept and importance of good citizenship through classroom-based learning;
- 2. Provide opportunities for students to learn the public policy process, from problem identification to solution-making;
- Improve student's communication and lobbying skills of proposed community-based policies;
- Provide network and application opportunities for students to implement their proposed policies to communities in partnership with either their city, provincial, municipal, or barangay leaders.
