#### 2023 UNITED NATIONS DAY

- 1. The United Nations (UN) is an international organization that was established in 1945. It now has 193 member countries. The United Nations' mission and work are driven by the aims and ideals outlined in its founding charter. Since 1948, October 24 has been observed as United Nations Day.
- 2. In 1971, the United Nations General Assembly recommended that the day be observed by Member States as a public holiday. By virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 138, s. 1949, the 24th day of October of every year was declared United Nations Day.
- 3. Following the UN's 78th Anniversary, this Division enjoins all schools in DepEd Dapitan City to commemorate in their classrooms or schools by creating microcelebrations integrated in the lessons or activities of the day.
